"Lost Baby" **Case Dropped**

DETROIT, Jan. 4.-A of the State Supreme Court at ansing today dropped the final curtain on Detroit's famous "lost baby" case of a decade ago. The ase resulted in a fruitless nationwide search by William Greatrex for the baby given by mistake man who later disappeared.

Failing to find the baby after years search, Greatrex brought suit against the Evangelical Deaconess Hospital of Detroit for \$200,000 laiming negligence on the part of an employe in turning over the child to the wrong parent. Supreme Court today upheld a lower court decision denying the damages on the grounds that, while great wrong" had been done, Greatrex had no redress against a on-profit institution.

In 1923 Greatrex' wife died short after giving birth to the child, a boy. The child was placed in the hospital. Two days later Greatrex called for the infant to discover another in its place bearing the Greatrex name.

A frantic search revealed that a nurse, mistaking the parentage, had given the baby to one Alfone Vlemminck, whose daughter a few days previously had given birth to

boy. One week later Vlemminck was ocated. Greatrex besought him to give back his child and receive in return the child that belonged to Vlemminck's daughter.

"I gave the baby to two strangers from Eastern Pennsylvania. I tell the truth. That is all," was Vlemminck's reply to Greatrex Continued questioning failed to shake his story. A few weeks later he disap-


