**The Wenonah Carriage Parade will take place June 7th, 1992  
(not June 14th as previously advertised)**

*June 7th will be the date for the Annual Harry A. DeHart, Jr., Carriage Parade through Wenonah, ending in Wenonah park.*

*Unfortunately, due to an error in communications, the wrong date was reported on the Wenonah Calendar as well as the Wenonah Municipal Alliance Newsletter.*

*Along with the corrected date, information is being included which hopefully will make your watching of the horses and carriages more enjoyable.*

## **The Day's Program**

The Carriage Participants will trailer their horses and carriages (referred to as "turnouts") onto the Underwood-Memorial Horse Show grounds at the Gloucester County College and "put-to" in time to parade through the ring at approximately 12 noon.

Next, they will proceed at a trot on a five mile drive to and through Wenonah, ending at Wenonah Park for a picnic at approximately one o'clock. Commentary on each carriage will be given upon its arrival at Wenonah Park.

Each carriage will select a spot to park and will be served picnic lunches for each person aboard. All the Volunteers who worked on this event will also be given lunches. The lunches have been donated by the drive's Sponsor, Betty DeHart, in appreciation to the people who made the drive possible.

Following the picnic, the carriages will return to the Horse Show Grounds and to their trailers. Each turnout will be unhitched and the horses, carriages and harnesses will be carefully loaded for the trip home.

## **Calling All Spectators:**

Spectators may observe the carriages anywhere along the route, including from Wenonah Park, as the Parade passes the Park before returning to enjoy picnicking.

For those who are fortunate enough to live along the route, it is a wonderful time to invite your friends and relatives to join you while the carriages go by - a great excuse for a party!

All spectators are invited and encouraged:

- to join the carriages in the Park
- to talk with and ask the drivers any questions
- to observe the lovely horses and carriages while stationary
- to take photographs
- to bring lunches and join the drivers and their guests as they picnic

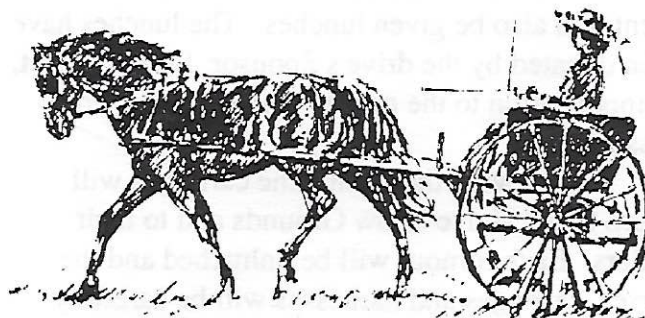

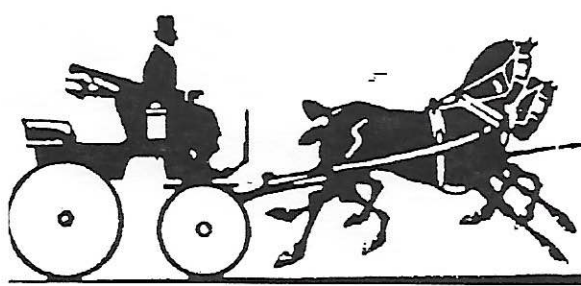
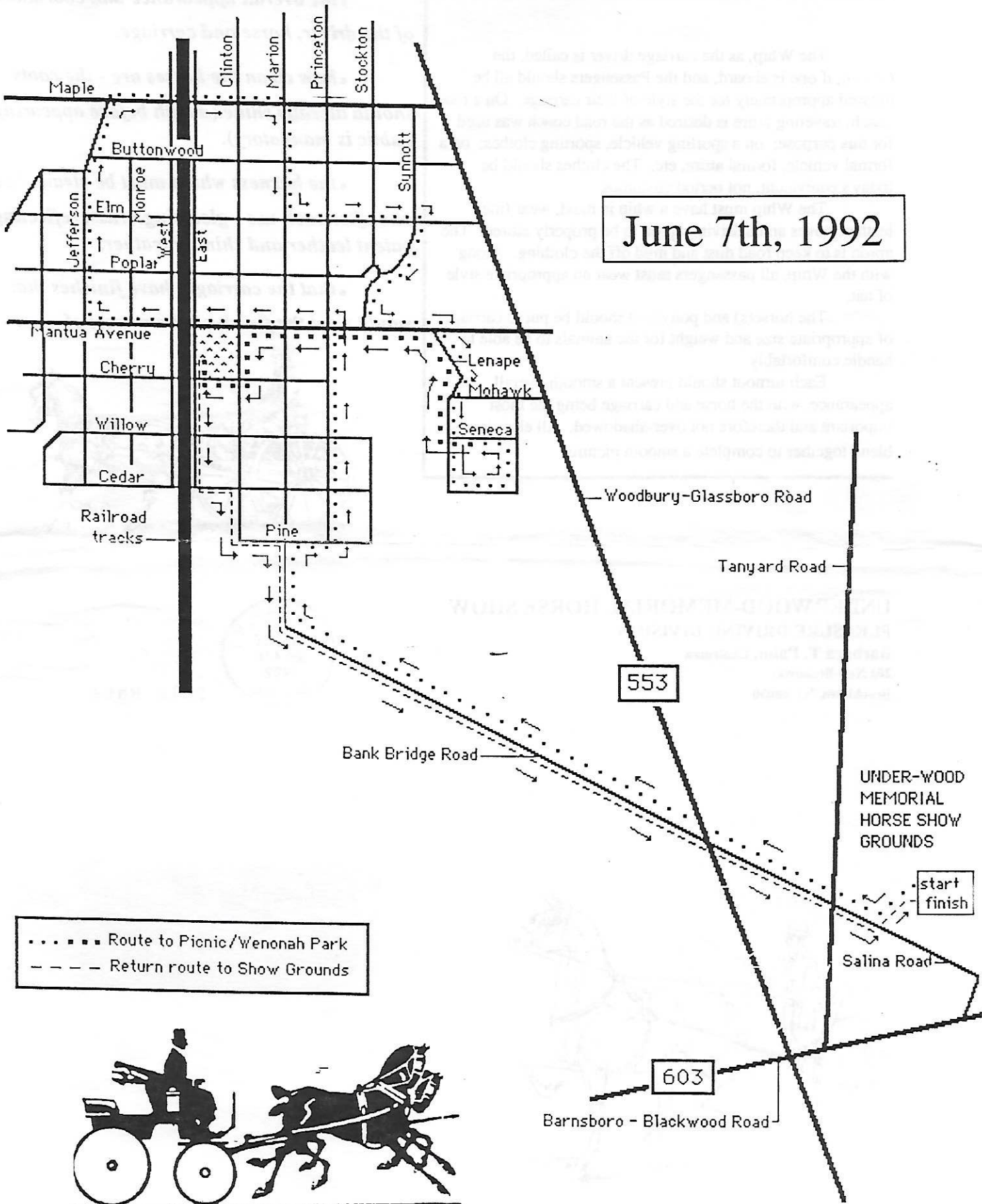

## Continuing the Tradition -

The Whip, as the carriage driver is called, the Groom, if one is aboard, and the Passengers should all be dressed appropriately for the style of their carriage. On a road coach, traveling attire is desired as the road coach was used for this purpose; on a sporting vehicle, sporting clothes; on a formal vehicle, formal attire, etc. The clothes should be today's equivalent, not period costumes.

The Whip must have a whip in hand, wear fine leather gloves and a driving apron to be properly attired. The apron is to keep road dust and mud off the clothing. Along with the Whip, all passengers must wear an appropriate style of hat.

The horse(s) and pony(ies) should be put to carriages of appropriate size and weight for the animals to be able to handle comfortably.

Each turnout should present a smooth overall appearance, with the horse and carriage being the most important and therefore not over-shadowed. All else should blend together to complete a smooth picture.

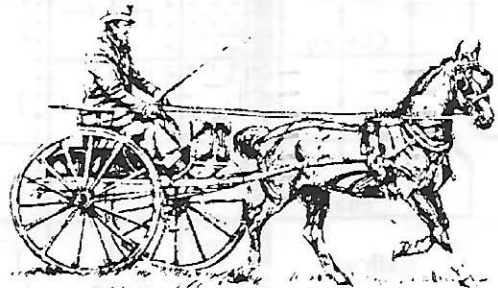
## TAKE SPECIAL NOTICE OF:

• *the overall appearance and coordination of the driver, horse and carriage.*

• *how clean the horses are - the coats should literally shine (a bath before appearing in public is mandatory).*

• *the harness which must be cleaned before and after each use - gleaming brass, reflecting patent leather and shining leather.*

• *that the carriages have finishes that would rival the finish on the newest of cars.*
