Dr. Steven Squyres, whose love for science was nurtured at Wenonah Elementary School, returns to his hometown as guest speaker in the park following the Fourth of July parade.

Born and raised in Wenonah, the Cornell University professor was the lead engineer on NASA's highly successful twin rovers Mars expedition.

He told former Wenonah Mayor Jack Sheppard Sr., "At Wenonah Elementary I had my first lessons in skills like math and writing that have become so important to me in later years. At Gateway, I got my first real training in the earth sciences, chemistry, and physics -- training that I still put into use every day as we explore Mars with Spirit and Opportunity (landing vehicles)."

Squyres gives his parents, Art and Felicie, ample credit for his success: "If you want proof that parents can have a profound effect on their children's successes in life, you need look no further than my mother and dad."

Four years ago Squyres was the first to be honored on the Fourth of July as a "Wenonah Legend."
