WRENOTH — "I sing because I'm glad to be with people," said Mrs. Pamela Schepert of Willow Street. "I've been in the choir since I was 16."

At 81, Mrs. Schepert was recently given an award by the Wrenoth Methodist Church for 45 years of Sunday singing with the church choir.

Mrs. Schepert moved to Wrenoth when she was nine. She joined the church choir at 15 because "no girl's mother would want to sing five minutes without a singing somewhere."

AS A GIRL Mrs. Schepert made a weekly trip to Philadelphia for vocal lessons. After a few years of that, the young soprano embarked on a career of singing for her support.

She sang in hotels and sang on radio shows. She sang in church groups and for benefit just for fun. And she sang with the church choir. "I couldn't sing for any other little girl because for an 81-year-old woman, I will be singing in the choir."

Over the years her association with the church choir has been extremely rewarding. Mrs. Schepert's time in the choir has been a joy to be a part of. "I have a good time, I have a lot of friends, I have a lot of people. There's very one to be with."
