## **General Membership Meeting**

The Wenonah Historical Society (WHS) met at 7:30 PM on **November 12, 2021 IN PERSON** at the Community Center! This was our first in-person meeting since February 2020 when the COVID pandemic forced cancellation of public gatherings. President Charlie Horan called the meeting to order.

He introduced Borough Council member, Dan Cox, who spoke briefly about proposed renovations in the Wenonah Park following the September 1 tornado. Dan showed a park map and asked members to note their suggestions on the map. A committee will consider all ideas and develop a master plan which will be implemented in the coming years.

Charlie thanked Nora Taylor for organizing the **6**<sup>th</sup> **annual Cemetery Walk** which incorporated several new ideas – Dining with the Dearly Departed, live music presented by Quattro Bassi Quartet, and a scavenger hunt for young people.

## **New Business**

Lou McCall proposed that we add two Vice Presidents to our Board of Trustees. This suggestion will be considered in the future as it requires an amendment to our bylaws.

Vicki McCall circulated a list of committees and projects so that members could consider joining a project that interests them.

Karen Heller announced that the **Whitall House** museum will be holding their annual Candlelight Tours on December 3 (6 to 9 PM), 4 (3 to 9 PM), and 5 (4 to 7 PM). Admission is free. Unique, handmade gifts will be available at the Holiday Pop Up Shops on the grounds of the house.
