The items included: a 1927 church directory; a newsletter prepared by the church about the men and women serving in World War II; and four "refrigerator magnets" replicating 4<sup>th</sup> of July program covers.

Charlie displayed an atlas/gazetteer which was donated to the Wenonah Historical Society by Kirby and Kingsley Lentz in memory of their mother, Marjorie Lentz. The atlas is from 1876 and contains maps of Gloucester and Salem Counties. WHS is grateful to Kirby and Kingsley for their generosity.
