

# Wenonah Tri-Co Swim Champions



Wenonah Swim Club took its turn at winning the Tri-County swimming championships over the weekend.

Rallying in the final few events, the swimmers from Wenonah recaptured the crown, which it lost last year to Woodbine, which finished second this time around.

Woodbine was the host club for the championships, which attracted 22 South Jersey teams and more than 1200 swimmers for the two day event.

Kathy Love paced the champions by winning the individual medley and the breaststroke for girls 15-18 and swimming a leg on the winning freestyle relay team.

Miss Love, in addition, cracked a meet record by swimming the breaststroke event in 28.8 seconds.

Four other records were broken and another tied.

Mark Goodwin of Pomona broke the freestyle standard for boys 11 and 12 in 28.7 and set another mark by swimming the butterfly event in 21.6.

The Pomona medley relay team (12 and under) composed of brothers Gordon and Gary King, Goodwin and Walter Kornienko cracked a standard in 22.0.

Steve Chojnacki, Glenn McCloskey, Mark Depman and Tony Knox of Woodbine lowered the 12-and-under freestyle relay mark to 2:05.9.

Bill Shum of Westwood tied the breaststroke record for boys 13 and 14 with a 33.7 effort.

Pomona finished third in the meet with 84 points followed by Brookside, 87, Sunnybrook, 83, Wedgwood, 82½, and Cherry Valley 79½.
